Charlotte married Richard Anderson in 1958, and though the marriage was not to last, from this union was born her daughter, Cheryl Lynn. Cheryl was later adopted from Charlotte's husband, Edward Netterberg.

In 1963, Charlotte completed a three-year nursing degree at the Methodist School of Nursing in Mitchell, SD. In her graduating class, she was the recipient of the Paul and Mary Dibble Award that recognized her for academics, ability in clinical areas, personality, and future contribution to the nursing profession. Charlotte not only excelled in achieving a nursing degree, but was able to manage this while raising her daughter, Cheryl, as a single mother. Charlotte went on to have a long career at the Fort Meade Veterans Administration Hospital near Sturgis, SD, retiring in 1994.

In 1982, Charlotte married her life partner, John Jordan, at the historic Fort Meade Chapel. This marriage extended Charlotte's family to include John's children, Aaron, Jenifer, and Karena. John and Charlotte packed a lot of memories into their 34-year marriage. 
