Thelma Froke, age 93, of Sioux Falls, formerly of Willow Lake, died on her birthday, November 28, 2023, in Sioux Falls with family at her side.

Thelma loved baking and cooking, being very well known for her delicious homemade buns and lefsa. She also enjoyed music and dancing (even in her walker), video lottery, card games and socializing any chance she got. She was a member of the Brandon VFW Auxiliary.
