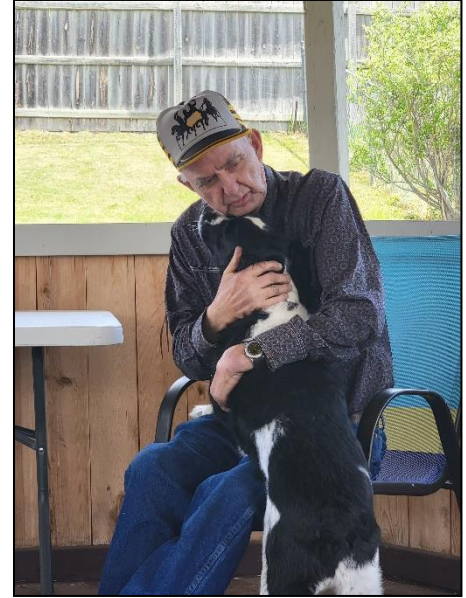
David D. Rosenau, 80, Belle Fourche, died, Tuesday, September 20, 2022, a Monument Health Spearfish.
