Over the course of her life, she made many gifts to organizations like this to help victims of abuse reclaim their lives and to raise their children in peaceful homes. She volunteered at the women's shelter and the Hospice House. She was a powerful role model in caring for our fellow human beings.

Kathy loved everything that grows on God's green earth. She had a passion for planting, harvesting and preserving the healthy foods that came from the amazing gardens she and Bess grew. Together she and Bess developed a particular love for the iris and their beautiful collection of irises was well-known to many. Kathy was a voracious reader and a natural teacher who loved to engage on long conversations about any topic under the sun. She was an incredibly interesting person to talk to and loved to share her knowledge and experience with everyone. Kathy trained for and became a Reiki Master.

Kathy and Bess were proudly married on September 6, 2015, along with eleven other couples at Mount Rushmore. They made a loving life together for 34 years.


