

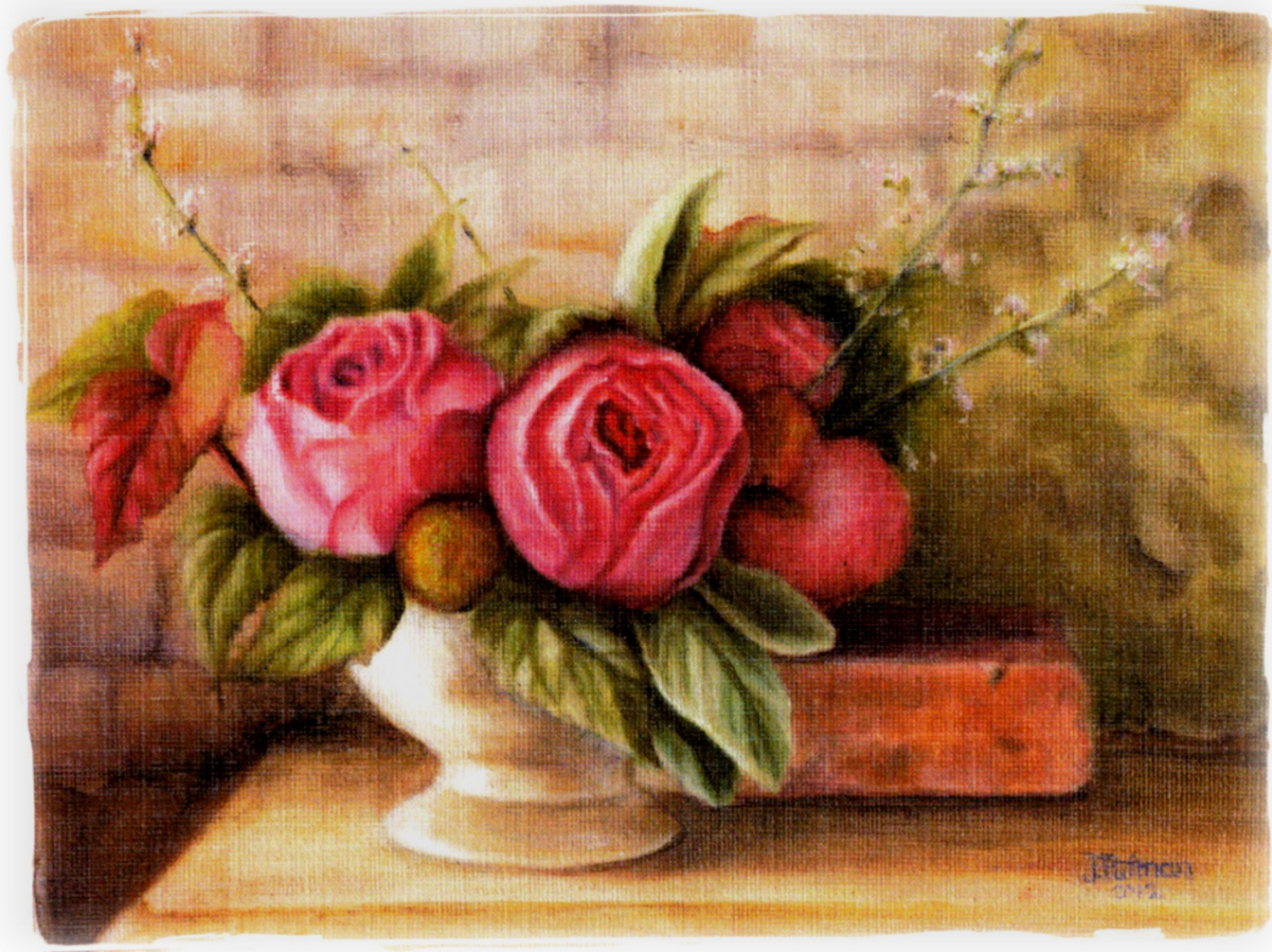
Her Journey's Just Begun
