The day God called you home.

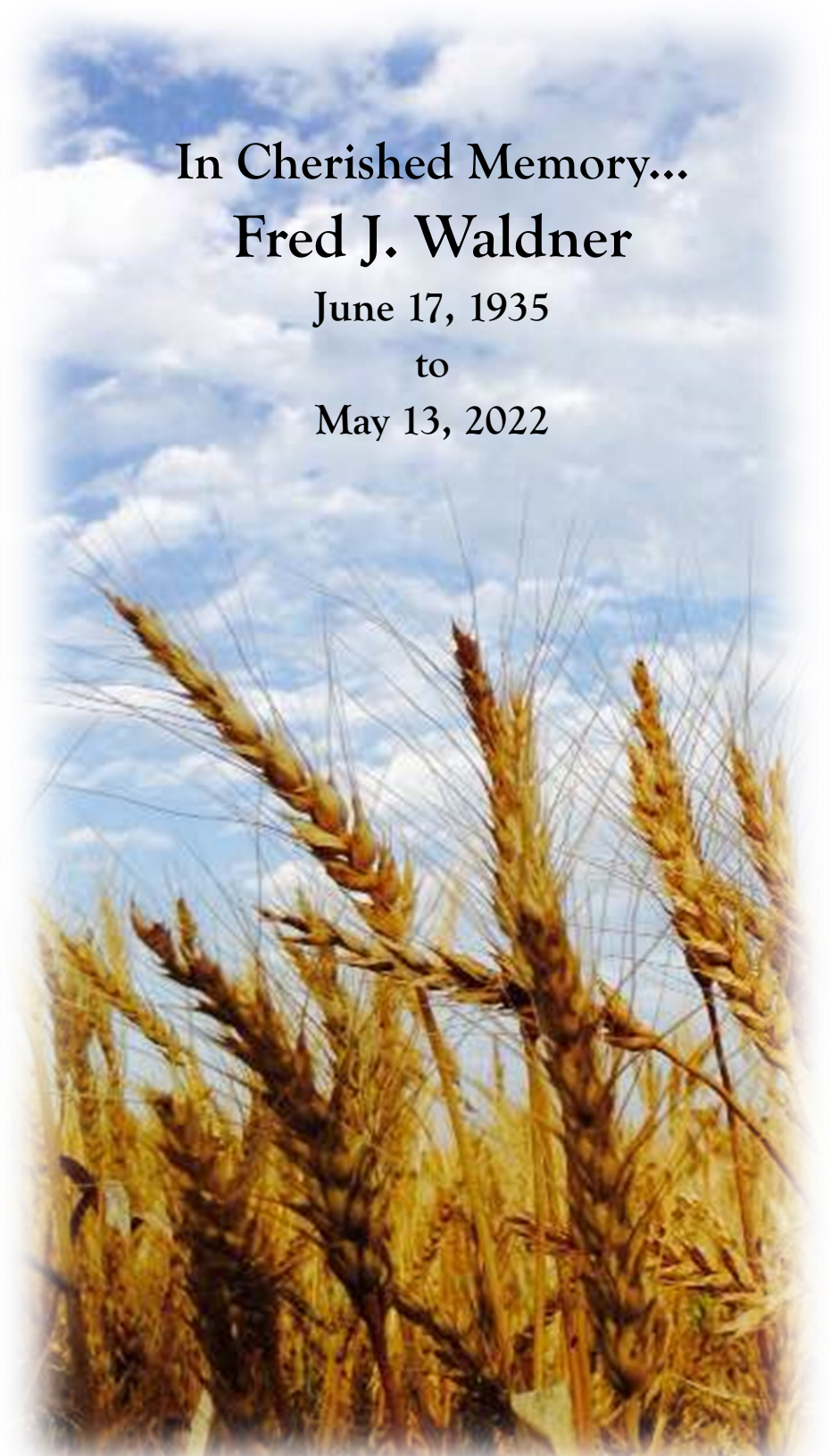
