Reserved Robinson was concerned about the neighborhood youth, especially during the summer months when they were at home with nothing constructive to do. He and a few other concerned men decided to make a difference by coaching them in baseball and softball and forming teams. It was a win-win situation for all involved and God got the glory.

He once had the opportunity to go on a fishing trip with a friend to Bimini Bahamas. While he enjoyed his mini vacation and the scenery, he was not satisfied with his catch of unfamiliar fish.
