

William R. McDonagh

William R. McDonagh was born August 2, 1930, in Miles City, MT to James and Violet (Reiley) McDonagh.

William worked with his father on the family farm and was also a fireman for the railroad in Miles City, MT.

He served in the US Army from 1951 to 1953. Discharged in 1953, and worked with his dad and older brother until July of 1956, when he enlisted in the US Air Force. After

his discharge, he worked at Hill Air Force Base in cable maintenance as a civilian from June 1963, until January 1987.

In January of 1961 he married Irene (Cluff). They were married until her passing in January 1994. On September 29, 1995, he married Mary Madell (Schuster) and they were married until the time of his death.

William, 83, Sturgis, died May 25, 2014, at Sturgis Regional Hospital after a lengthy illness.
