This marriage ended in divorce in 1971. In 1974, Bob married Lorna L. Stiles at the Presidio, Monterey, CA.

On February 1, 1975, Chief Warrant Officer Shevling retired from the US Navy and returned with his wife and family to South Dakota and to the farm where he was raised. In 1976, he went to work as chief engineer for Kleven Communications, Sturgis, SD, and worked in their radio stations at Dickinson, ND, St. Cloud, MN, Milbank, SD, Jackson, MN, and the home station at Sturgis, SD. In 2009, they sold the Arizona home and returned to South Dakota to live at their new home in Belle Fourche.




Miss Me - But Let Me Go
