

# Footprints

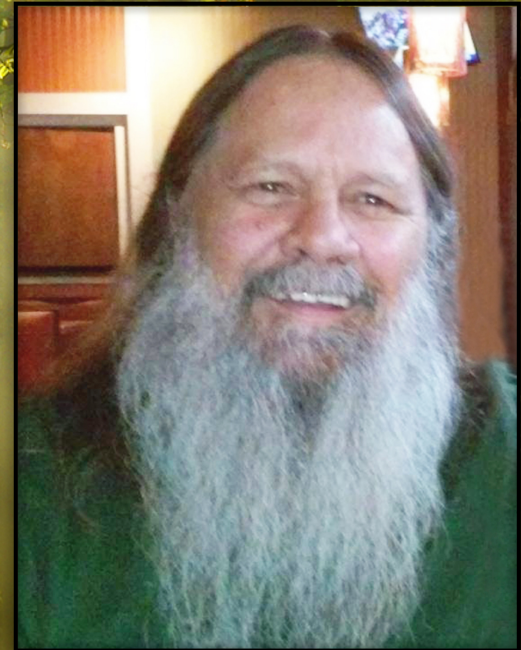
**One night I had a dream.**
