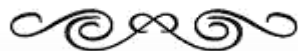


When I'm Gone

Richard Lee Zugschwerdt was born at Milwaukee, WI on April 9, 1926, the son of Lee William and Esther (Henske) Zugschwerdt. Dick was only 6 weeks old when his mother died. His grandparents, John and Emma Zugschwerdt raised him near Garden City. He attended school graduating from Garden City High School in 1944. He then farmed near Garden City.

In 1947 he was united in marriage to Clarine Wook-ey. To this union 4 children were born, Cheryl, Debora, Larry, and Doreen. This marriage later ended in a divorce. Dick later married Bonnie Alcorn, she died in 2011.

Besides farming, he owned and operated Dick's Hardware in Garden City in the 50's and then went to work for Gates Rubber Co. in Colorado for over 31 years as a maintenance engineer.
