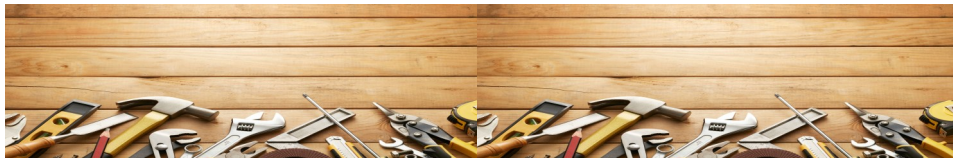
Marvin was married to Mavis Hilsabeck for 32 years and had three children; Lon, Jody, and Joel.
