my life was in His hands*

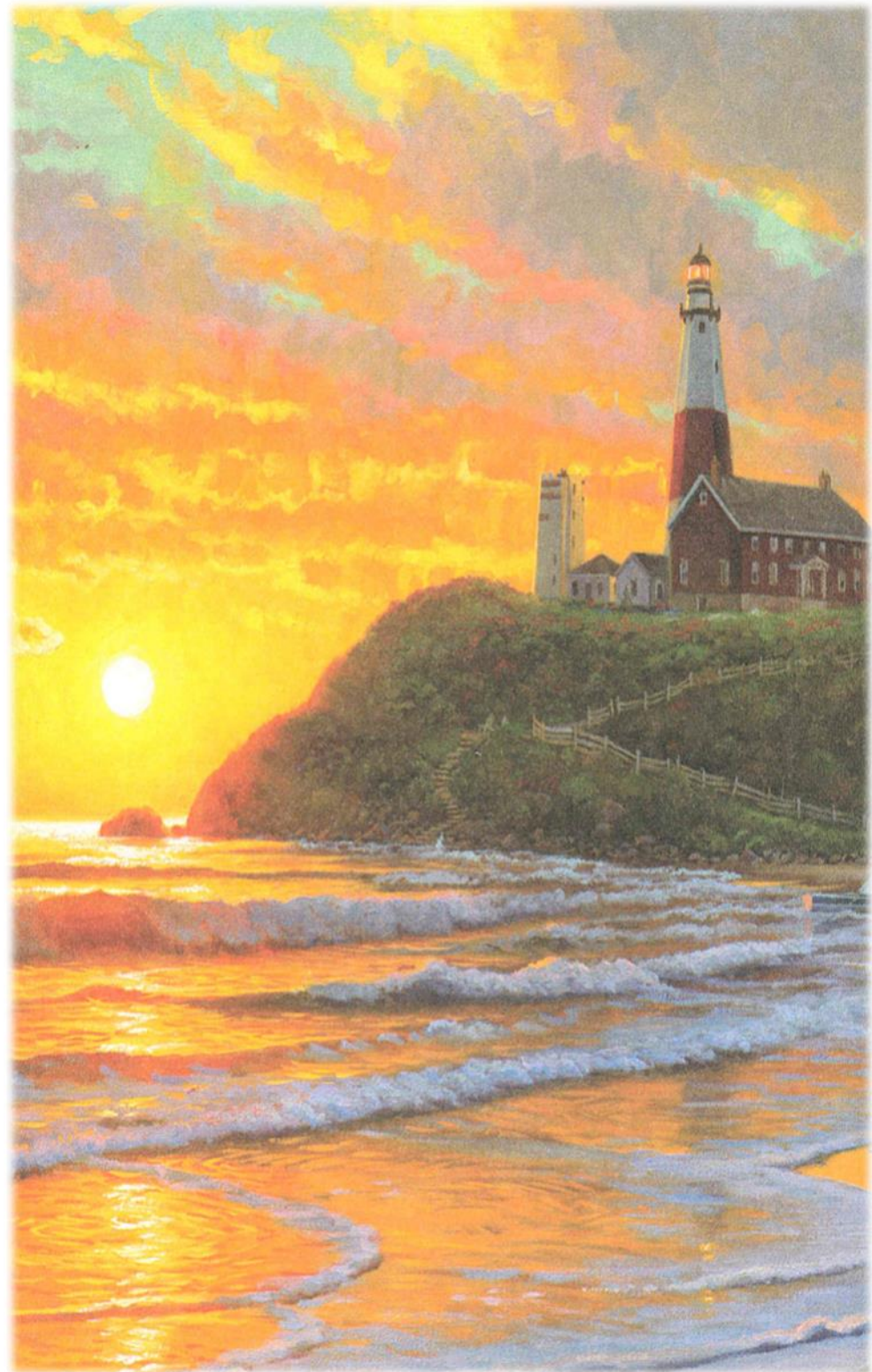

Reverend Clifford Eugene Jackson, born on July 31, 1943, has departed from this earthly realm on February 18, 2024, to join the Lord and the saints who have gone before him. At the age of 80, he concluded his journey here on earth, leaving behind a legacy of faith, love, and joy.
