Lyman Waldner

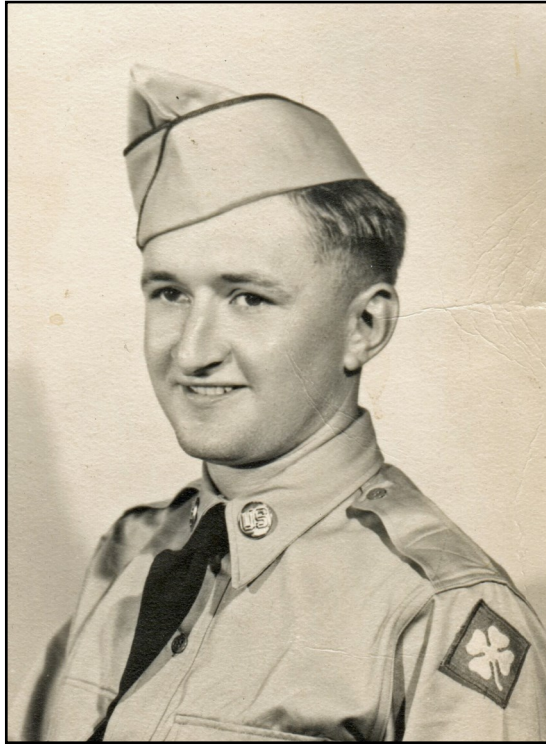
December 1, 1931 — October 28, 2023
