

## Irvin Delmar Putzier



Irvin Delmar "Zeke" Putzier, nearly 90, was born November 21, 1933, in Carter, SD, to Irvin and Ethel Putzier. He was the fourth of ten children. He fell asleep in death on October 19, 2023, after many years of health problems, including Parkinson's and heart disease, surrounded by loving family and friends, and the caring nursing staff at Seven Sisters Living Center, where he spent the last few weeks of his life.

Of all the things Irvin loved, he loved his God Jehovah the most. After a deep study of the Bible, he made a personal decision at 20 years old to dedicate his life to Jehovah and was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses on July 31, 1954.
