

## Jacqueline Cromity November 21, 1978 - May 5, 2025

Jacqueline Cromity, affectionately known as Jackie, a remarkable woman whose life was a testament to strength, faith, and unwavering determination, transitioned to her heavenly home on Monday, May 5, 2025. Born on November 21, 1978, Jackie fought a courageous battle against cancer for nearly 14 years, always holding steadfast to her faith in Jesus Christ.

Jackie came from humble beginnings, in Watha, North Carolina where she was raised alongside her five brothers and sisters. After losing her mother to cancer at an early age, her father nobly took on the role of a single parent, providing a loving and supportive environment for Jackie and her siblings. Raised in the church, Jackie received her spiritual foundation from Holy Ghost Cathedral in Mt. Olive, under the leadership of Reverend Preston and Jessie May Grimes. Despite facing numerous challenges while in school, Jackie persevered and thrived in her postgraduate studies, embodying the belief that your beginnings do not define your future. She obtained her Bachelor of Computer Science at Winston-Salem State University and her Master of Business Administration from North Carolina State University. Her life was a true testament to the power of faith and resilience, demonstrating that with God, all things are possible.

Jackie's leadership skills and spiritual journey were profoundly strengthened in an uncommon place, Rochester, Minnesota. It was there that her professional career began at IBM, where she quickly rose through the ranks due to her exceptional talent and dedication. An entrepreneur and tech management professional, she spent over 20 years overseeing global teams, traveling internationally, and successfully leading multi-million-dollar development programs and services. After leaving IBM, Jackie's expertise and leadership continued to shine at Cisco, where she served as a senior leader, overseeing an international team. Jackie's dedication extended beyond her professional and entrepreneurial endeavors. She served as a project manager for the Technology Conference sponsored by Life for Africa, a strategic board member at the Raleigh Rescue Mission, and a board director for First Bank in the Raleigh Triangle area. She also founded Genuine Self Images (GSI), a 501(c)(3) organization empowering teen girls and young women. She was a profound motivational speaker and was known for her authenticity and inspiration, drawing from her real-life experiences to uplift and motivate others.

Her personal journey with cancer inspired her to launch Survivor Friendly®, a boutique dedicated to providing durable medical equipment and support to breast cancer survivors. This endeavor has now grown into eight successful locations throughout North Carolina, including affiliations with Duke Cancer Institute and Novant Health. She also founded the Survivor Friendly Foundation which provides free services, products, and essentials to women battling cancer. Her organization has distributed thousands of care bags to women over the years. Jackie was not only a distributor of products, she was an advocate, working to influence policies to benefit patients. She was consulted on the Lymphedema Treatment Act, a federal law passed in 2022. This act aims to ensure patients have better access to essential compression garments and supplies. Jackie's heart desire was to educate the public, so women do not suffer in silence while they battle this disease. Jackie leaves behind a legacy of love and resilience.
