



Obituary



AARON IVERSON WALTER HUNTER III was born on November 29, 1972, here in Tulsa to Alice Hunter and Aaron Hunter, and lived a life defined by integrity, generosity, laughter, and quiet strength. He was a man of his word—steady, dependable, and deeply principled—and those who knew him understood that his character spoke louder than any title or accomplishment. Aaron believed in doing the right thing, showing up for others, and living with honesty and dignity, even when

life demanded more than seemed fair.

Aaron attended Edison High School, where he graduated in 1991. After high school, he continued his education at Tulsa Junior College, now known as Tulsa Community College, where he studied radiology. Though his professional path later changed, his dedication to learning and personal growth remained a constant throughout his life.

Aaron went on to dedicate 21 years of service to the United States Postal Service, where he built a career rooted in commitment, responsibility, and service. His long tenure reflected not only a strong work ethic, but also his sense of duty and reliability—qualities that defined him both professionally and personally. Beyond his dedication to his work, Aaron was known by his coworkers for his humor and warmth. His work friends often shared that he made the workday enjoyable, always finding a way to joke, laugh, or put a smile on someone's face. Even on the hardest days, Aaron had a gift for lifting spirits and making others feel seen.

For 15 years, Aaron endured chronic illness and lived with daily pain, a burden he carried with remarkable perseverance and grace. Despite the physical challenges he faced, he

remained patient, kind, and resilient. He met each day with courage and humility, rarely complaining and never allowing his suffering to define him. Those closest to him witnessed a strength that went far beyond endurance—a strength rooted in faith, forgiveness, and love. Aaron had a joyful spirit and an infectious laugh. He loved joking, teasing, and bringing laughter into every room he entered. He found genuine joy in making others smile and had a natural ability to put people at ease. Whether with family, friends, or coworkers, his laughter brought comfort, connection, and light.

He found joy in the simple and meaningful things in life. He loved watching sports and following his favorite teams. He had a deep interest in ancestry and family history, spending time researching where he came from and honoring the generations before him. Most of all, he cherished time spent with family, valuing connection, togetherness, and love above all else.

Music was another constant source of joy in Aaron's life. He loved listening to music and was known for creating his own mixes, carefully selecting songs that spoke to his spirit. Music brought him comfort, reflection, and peace, and it remained a meaningful part of his daily life. Through music, he expressed emotion, found solace, and connected to memories that mattered deeply to him.

What defined Aaron most profoundly was his capacity to forgive and his commitment to grace. He believed in mercy over resentment, understanding over judgment, and love over bitterness. His forgiveness was not weakness—it was strength shaped by faith, compassion, and a deep understanding of what truly matters.

Aaron was preceded in death by his parents, Alice Hunter and Aaron Iverson Walter Hunter, Jr. He leaves behind his beloved wife, Verliisa Ann Hunter; daughter, A'reanna Monáe Hunter; and cherished grandson, Sir Cristian Thiago Aaron Hunter-Rico, all of whom loved him dearly and will forever carry his memory in their hearts. He is also survived by his brothers, Marcus Hunter (Brenda), Kevin Hunter, and Kyle Hunter (Sharon).
