Lillian enjoyed sewing, quilting, card playing, fishing, dancing, playing the piano, and traveling. She was always happy for the opportunity to serve a cup of coffee to friends or neighbors.

In the spring of 2009, Lillian moved to Garden Hills Assisted Living in Spearfish where she lived until her passing.
