Victor, 83, Custer, died Saturday, December 17, 2011, at the Fort Meade VA Hospital.

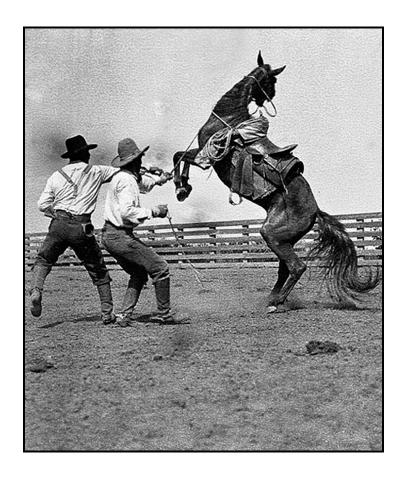

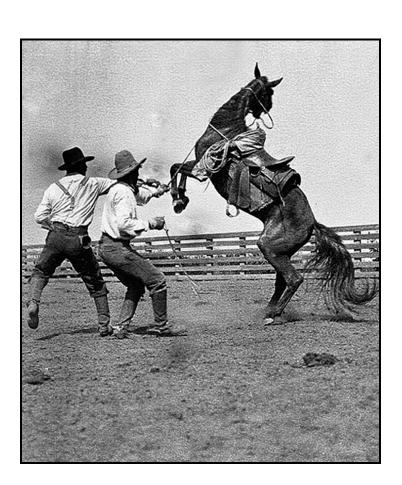
