



## **Delbert Martin Eisenbraun**

Delbert Martin Eisenbraun was born June 19, 1928, to Herbert and Emma (Willuweit) Eisenbraun at Creighton, SD. As an infant, he was brought to the Lord in Holy Baptism at Emmanuel Lutheran Church, and later was confirmed in his faith, in Jesus, in German, at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Creighton, SD.
