LuAnne Williams was born January 10, 1932 to A.H. (Bud) and Dorothy (Otto) Williams on the Otto farm near Vayland, SD. She was baptized on January 15, 1933 at Divine Services in the Community Church at Vayland. At the age of 4, her family moved to California, where the family grew with the addition of her brother, Doug. In 1941, upon their return to South Dakota, she attended the Otto School and graduated 8th grade at Springdale School near Vayland. In her own words, "it was a pretty simple childhood full of trials and tribulations like most." She graduated from Wessington High School in 1950.



On January 13, 1951, LuAnne was united in marriage to Leonard E. Fritzsche at the Wessington Community Church in Wessington, SD. LuAnne and Leonard lived on the Earl Fritzsche homestead near Wessington where they created a full life together, with LuAnne raising their family (Kevin & Jeff) and helping her husband in farming and the Len's Grocery store business venture.
