I have lived life independently in the community for many years and though I may have a disability that does NOT make me disabled.

I walk with the use of my walker, groomed myself, went to restaurants in the community, shopped independently in the community, and did everything on my own. The only form of assistance that I would need was transportation.

I am able to utilize a phone and call staff or my family without assistance before I became ill and was admitted to PLH.

I would chew my medications in the morning, noon, evening, and night, and wash them down with my favorite soda, Mountain Dew. I did not receive assistance from staff with administering my medications.

Things you should know about me:

I love Mountain Dew.

I love fried chicken, hotdogs, mashed potatoes, regular Lays potato chips, saltine crackers, pizza, and vanilla ice cream (in moderation).

I have a slow response time but I am aware of everything that is said to me, it just takes me longer to A. process the information and B. respond.

If you notice my eye twitching this is me processing things.

I see things as black and white...When things are made simple, I tend to cooperate better. When things are too difficult, I will not cooperate.

I have strived on being independent for 69 years. I am strong willed and don't like being forced to do anything. It's all in your approach.

I like to be clean, I do not like facial hair, I would always wear clean attire.

I love music and have always had it playing. I had 4 radios in my apartment that played all different stations. Christian and Country music would be two of my favorites.

I also enjoy watching baseball.


