He worked for Barber Transportation during this time, where he got to know a lot of the business owners as he "peddled freight" to the Sturgis Main Street. He also worked for the Anderson / Stingley Funeral Home; mostly so he could drive fast! He always loved to tell a good story!

Then he transferred to Peter Kiewit & Sons, where he worked as a heavy equipment operator. He worked on many bridges both in Wyoming and South Dakota. He told many stories about the clean-up of the flood of 72. Then he transferred to the Amax Coal Company where he worked until he retired in 1995. He earned many belt buckles that he was very proud of during his time with Amax.


After he retired, they bought a campground by Tilford and worked it until Arvetta got too sick to handle the day to day activities of a campground and so they sold it, bought a camper and moved to Tennessee, where Arvetta had family. They lived there several years until Arvetta wanted to come back to the Rapid City Hospital in South Dakota for treatment. She passed away on November 25, 2005; and Dennis promised her he would take care of Jerry for the rest of his life.
