He also enjoyed feeding his numerous stray cats over the years. He will be remembered by family and friends as a very kind and loving, softspoken man.

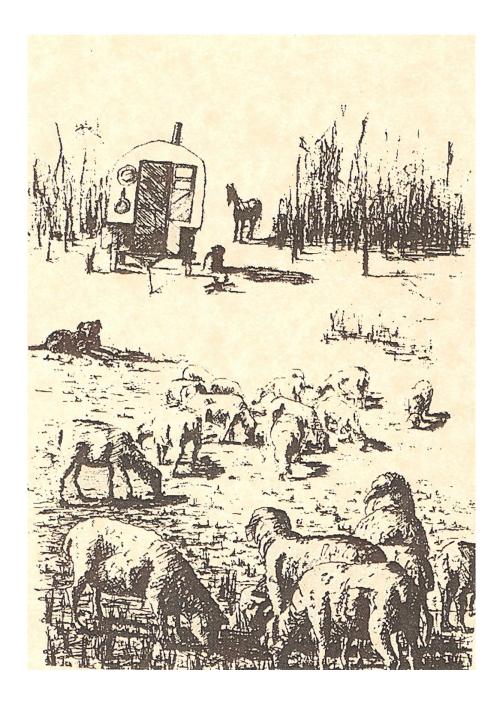
Marvin, 81, Newell, died Sunday, April 21, 2013, at the Fort Meade VA Healthcare Center.
