He earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Dakota State University in Madison, SD in 1986. Kirk was also a member of the South Dakota National Guard during his college years.

On July 10, 1992, he married Ann Katherine Bahde at St. Bernard Catholic Church in Redfield, SD and began his career at the South Dakota Developmental Center in Redfield. He then joined Amman Collection Agency in Aberdeen, SD, in 1993. In 2001, he and his family relocated to Clermont, FL, where he was employed for Westgate Blue Tree Resort. He and his family moved to Lebanon, OH in 2003, where he was Vice President of Collections at Federated Department Stores.
