Leonard and Eunice moved to Sturgis in 1992 where he resided until entering the Dorsett Care Center in Spearfish in June of 2011.

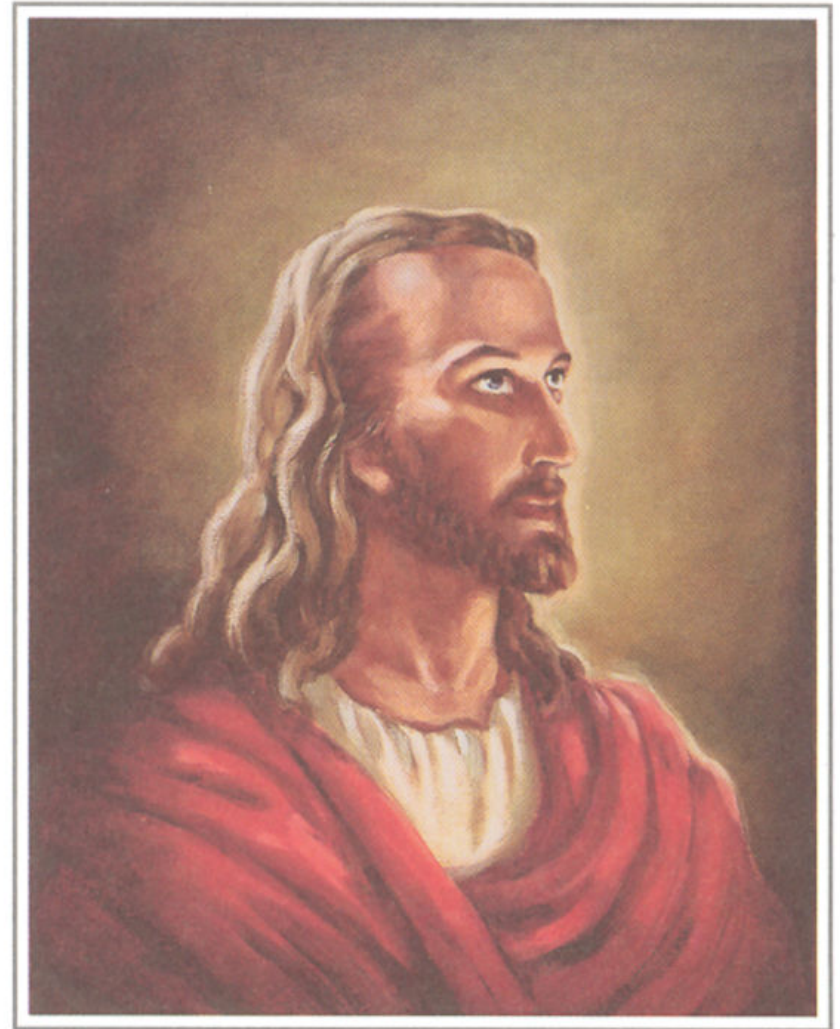
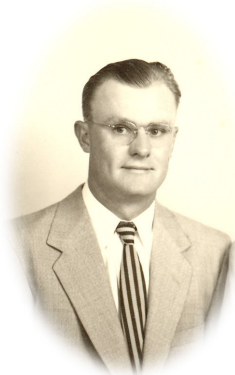
Leonard, 85, Sturgis, died Saturday, July 14, 2012, at the Rapid City Regional Hospital.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, and his son, Douglas.

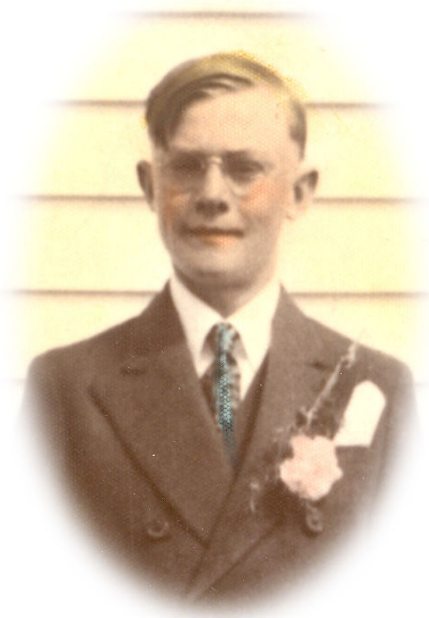
