She taught many of us how to fish and hunt, (she was a dead-eye shot on a jackrabbit or prairie dog).

Jo was preceded in death by her son, Billy Joe; her husband, Floyd Strong; her brothers, Vernon, Bernard, Ronald, and Marvin Anders. Her sisters-in-law, Doris, Lucille, Wanda and Carolyn Anders and her great-nephew, Travis Anders.

She is survived by her remaining nieces and nephews, and many special friends.
