Shirley Rose Zaske, 88, Box Elder, died on Wednesday, June 26, 2013, at the Golden Living, Bella Vista Senior Care Center in Rapid City.

Shirley was born on February 18, 1925, at McIntosh, SD, to George and Rose Ellen (Marshall) Mackay. She grew up in the rural Morristown area and attended rural school through the eighth grade. She went on to graduate from Morristown High School in
