**Doctor Randall Choice III**, commonly known as to as “**Dock**,” was the son of Reverend Doctor R. Choice and Mother Annie Mae Stephens Choice. He was born in Greenville, Florida, on January 13, 1938. Not only did his parents instill godly principles, but they also encouraged him and his siblings to reach their full potential in everything they aspired to do, even if it seemed impossible for them to do during that era. He was a lifelong resident of the Madison County community.

**Dock** grew up in a household where faith was valued, God was honored, and church attendance was expected. He accepted Christ as his Redeemer at an early age and became a member of New Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Greenville. He continued to grow spiritually and responsibly and later in life, he became the Trustee Board Chairman.

**Dock’s** mother, who was a school teacher, taught him at home before he was old enough to be enrolled. Therefore, when he began first grade, he was ahead and he continued to soar academically. He graduated from Greenville Training School in 1955, holding the esteemed position as Senior Class President and Valedictorian. Prior to that, he was the basketball team captain and a member of the track and field team. He pledged membership in the brotherhood of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity at Florida A & M University, but this did not distract him graduating Summa Cum Laude (highest academic honors) with his Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education. After teaching for a few years at Madison County Training School, he enrolled in Miami Dade College to earn a degree in Mortuary Science. He completed his internship at Tillman Funeral Home in Monticello, Florida, and became the first licensed African American funeral director in Madison County. Dock’s yearning for education continued as he enrolled at Saint Leo College to earn his Pre-Law degree. He exemplified a lifelong pursuit of gaining knowledge by validating the premise that one is never too old to learn.

**Dock** enlisted in the United States Army in June 1962 with his first deployment to France. He served his country honorably fulfilling positions as radio teller type operator, military police (MP), and first Sergeant of the Criminal Investigative Division (CID). Soon after his honorable discharge from active duty, he continued his service for fifteen additional years in the U.S. Army Reserves.

Because of his curiosity in learning and opportunities for personal growth, **Dock Choice** challenged himself to learn to do a variety of things. He was a school teacher in Madison County, FL, an insurance agent in Thomasville, GA, a car salesman in Bartow, FL, a police officer in Lake Wales, FL, a carpenter (construction) throughout North Florida, an 18-wheeler/truck driver certification, and Licensed Funeral Director at Manor Wright Funeral Home and Tillman Funeral Home. He had many rewarding career experiences, including owning D. R. Choice & Sons Funeral Home.



# A LETTER FROM ME TO YOU

## “MAY THE WORK I’VE DONE SPEAK FOR ME”

My beloved family,

If you are reading this, then my earthly work has come to a close—but my love for you has not ended. I write these words not with sorrow, but with peace, gratitude, and faith, trusting that the life I lived will speak louder than anything I could ever say.

I was born on January 13, 1938, in Greenville, Florida, to my loving parents, Rev. Doctor R. Choice and Mrs. Annie Mae Stephens Choice. They taught me early the value of faith, discipline, education, and service. Though they—and all my siblings—have gone on before me, I carry them with me still. Their sacrifices laid the foundation for every step I took.

From my earliest days at New Zion Missionary Baptist Church, I learned that service was not optional—it was required. I served as Chairman of the Trustee Board because I believed in stewardship, responsibility, and taking care of God’s house and God’s people. My faith anchored me, guided me, and sustained me through every season of life.

Education was one of my greatest joys. I gave it my all—becoming valedictorian of my high school and my Florida A&M University class, serving as Class President, and leading on the basketball court and track field. FAMU shaped me, strengthened me, and affirmed my calling. I was proud to be a Rattler, a scholar, and a man who believed that knowledge opens doors no one can close.

I wore many uniforms in my lifetime—student, soldier, teacher, mortician, officer, carpenter, driver—but each one was worn with honor. Serving in the United States Army, including my tour in France and years in the Reserve, taught me discipline, leadership, and courage. Rising to serve as Military Police and First Sergeant in the Criminal Investigative Division was never about rank—it was about responsibility.

My life’s dream was to own my own funeral home—not simply as a business, but as a ministry. I wanted to serve families with dignity, compassion, and respect during their most vulnerable moments. Becoming the first African American licensed mortician in Madison County was not about being first—it was about opening doors so others could follow.

To my children, grandchildren, and all whom I claim as family: you are my legacy. Every lesson I taught, every sacrifice I made, every long road I traveled was for you. I hope you saw perseverance when things were hard, humility when things went well, and faith in every season. Walk boldly. Love deeply. Serve faithfully. Never be afraid to work hard or to start over.

To my caregivers—thank you for loving me, standing by me, and honoring me with your care. Your kindness will never be forgotten.

When you think of me, don’t linger on how I left—remember how I lived. Remember the hands that worked, the mind that learned, the heart that served, and the faith that carried me home.

I leave you with this prayer:  
That my life encourages you.  
That my works speak for me.  
That my love surrounds you.
