
May the road

Louise was from Philadelphia. She was born to William and Lucy Holmes on April 23, 1937, and was the oldest of four children. Paul and Louise moved back to Clark in 2005, where Louise returned to work at the Clark Nursing Home. She joined the Clark Lions Club, continued to bowl in Watertown up until a few years ago, and attended St. Michael's Catholic Church. She enjoyed visits with her family and her friends, and reminiscing about her childhood and family in Philadelphia.

Louise died at the Clark Nursing Home on May 25, 2023.
