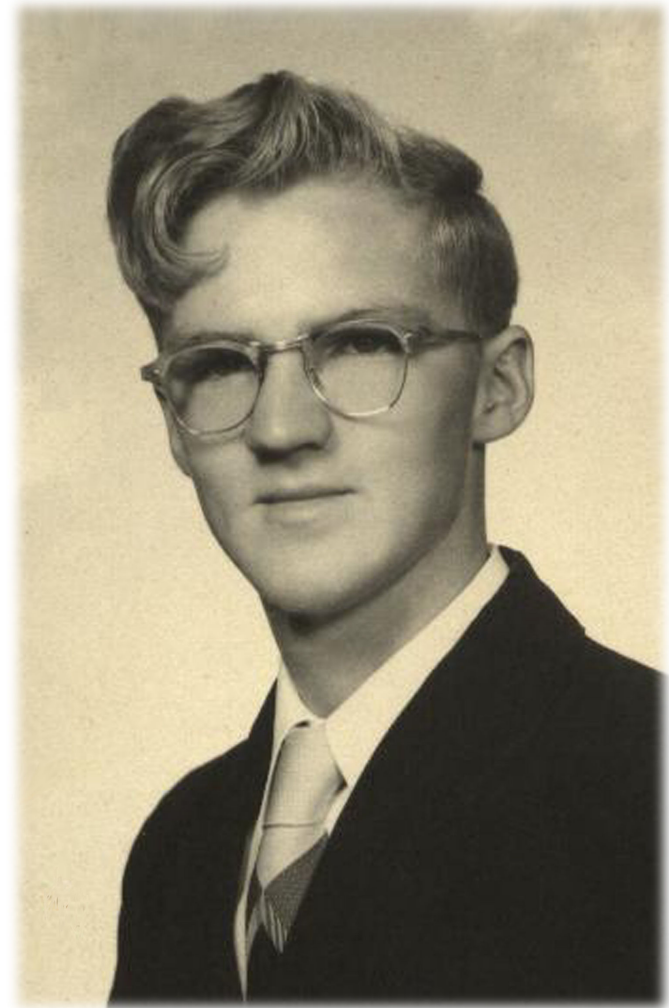
Carl, 73, longtime St. Maries, ID, area resident, died December 8, 2011, at St. Maries, ID.
