

Minister Charlene Kathleen Howard was born in Panama City in the Republic of Panama on December 9, 1982, to proud parents, Reverend Alex Junior Howard and Hyacinth Morris Archibold. Affectionately known as Chogo, she grew up at Arrianga and attended church at Ft. Clayton Base in Panama.

During the early years of her childhood, however, *Charlene* relocated with her family to Miami, Florida, where she continued to receive her formal education. She was a 2001 graduate of Dr. Michael Krop High School. Soon after, she relocated to Tallahassee, Florida, to advance her education at the Florida State University (FSU) earning a bachelor's degree in Sociology and Public Administration in 2006. She later enrolled in graduate school at the Florida Agricultural & Mechanical University (FAMU) to earn double master's degrees in Applied Social Science / Political Science in 2009. Charlene remained a resident of the Tallahassee community.

God placed her in this world to do something marvelous, and He groomed and grew her for His glory. *Minister Charlene* accepted the divine call into the ministry and church; she became a licensed and ordained minister/collegiate pastor of Life Changing Faith, Inc.
