Phyllis Lorraine Schmidt, age 89, died at the Prairie Lakes Hospital on Saturday, January 28, 2023 after a short illness.

Phyllis Lorraine Schmidt was born May 30, 1933 to Vern and Vera (Beavers) Herker on a farm near Raymond in Clark County. She was the fifth child born of sixteen; only fourteen of which grew to adulthood. Phyllis attended several country schools in the Clark and Raymond area before leaving home at age 14 to live by herself in Willow Lake to attend Willow Lake High School. During her high school years she worked several jobs to support herself as did many rural kids from that era. She graduated from Willow Lake High School in 1951. She was united in marriage to Menno H (Babe) Schmidt on June 17, 1951 in Willow Lake. Her son Allen, was born in April 1952, followed by Terry in January 1955, and Bob in July 1962.

In 1953 Phyllis started working at the Willow Lake Livestock Auction in the Café. She later moved to the sales office as a clerk working in the Willow Lake and DeSmet Sale Barns for several decades. Phyllis had many jobs throughout her life including Sexton at Collins Cemetery; but first and foremost, she was a farm wife and mother. From doing fieldwork to driving potato trucks or making hot meals for the men in the field, she was the glue that held everything together. She continued to help around the farm giving rides or running for parts as recently as the harvest of 2022.

Phyllis enjoyed traveling, quilting, reading, and attending family events. She was a member of the Willow Lake Evangelical Lutheran Church, Willow Lake Lioness and Lions Clubs, and part of a small group of women that recognized a need for a swimming pool in Willow Lake. With their skillful organizing and fundraising efforts, a strong foundation was built for the swimming pool to come to fruition.
