

In 1989 she and Ken moved to Moorhead, MN where Marian worked in a craft boutique until moving to Minneapolis in 1992 where they worked maintaining the building in which they lived. They finally settled in Andover, MN in 2000 at the Farmstead Senior Living Community where Marian lived independently until shortly before her death.
