
They Watch

Marise "Marci" Caster, age 83, of Clark, died peacefully Wednesday, December 6, 2023 at Avantara Care Center of Clark with family by her side.

Marise Elaine (Rader) Caster was born in Beloit, Kansas on February 20, 1940, to John and Leora (Lang) Rader. With her father as an engineer for Standard Oil, Marci and her brother, Jack, moved to various towns and cities before settling in Elmhurst, IL (a suburb of Chicago). Marci graduated from York High in 1958, then attended Beloit College on an academic scholarship her first year. She then transferred to Kansas State University where she earned a teaching degree.

Marci met Jim Caster at K-State and they were married August 18, 1962. Upon Jim's graduation from Veterinary Med School in 1963, they moved to Webster, SD where Jim took a job with Homer Caley and Marci took a first-grade teaching position. That love for travel spanned through the years including trips abroad with Jim and friends, as well as showing Mark and Sherri much of the United States.

Marci enjoyed gardening and also restoring the homes they lived in. She liked crafts, golf, playing cards, and reading. In 1984, the couple moved to Clark, SD where she taught kindergarten for several years and continued managing Cross Country Veterinarians. She was a member of the Clark PEO, a board member of the Emil M. Larson Library and a member of the Plymouth Congregational Church where she was very active in the women's fellowship. She was always busy.

Teaching was a joy to her and besides the love she had for each of her grand-children and great grandchildren, her other kids were her former kindergarteners. Marci was so blessed when past students came up at games or on the street and gave her a hug and caught her up on what was going on in their lives.

Preceding her in death were her parents John and Leora Rader.
