Michael Olson, formerly of Watertown, SD, passed away on April 6, 2025, in Chicago, IL.

Michael Matthew Olson was born on June 19, 1966, in Watertown, SD, to James S. Olson and Anita M. Gerber. Michael attended grade school in Florence, SD, middle school in Madison, SD, and graduated from Watertown High School. Michael immediately enlisted in the United States Navy, traveling to boot camp the day after his high school graduation. Graduating color from the Navy Great Lakes Naval Station, Michael went on to serve 9 years in the Navy, eventually becoming the youngest ever naval company commander at the age of 21. He was a kind and generous man with a quick wit and wickedly good sense of humor. Most of all, Michael cherished

moments spent with his family, particularly the several adventures they were able to share within the last couple of years.

Michael is survived by his beloved wife, Veronica; daughters: Kirsten (Troy Gallup) Olson, of MI, and Rachel (Joshua) Johnson, of MI; granddaughter Charlotte Johnson; mother, Anita Gerber of Clark, SD; grandmother Margaret Bergh, of Watertown, SD; brothers: Brian (Gwen) of TN, and Jon (Nancy) Gerber of CO; nieces Addison and Lilyan Gerber; and numerous aunts, uncles, and cousins.
