Good friends, good times, a loved one's touch.


Perhaps my time seemed all to brief. Don't lengthen it now with undue grief.

Elizabeth "Betty" Schaner, 98, formerly of Center, passed away January 27, 2026, at Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center in Bismarck.

Elizabeth was born January 5, 1928, the daughter of Kasper and Barbara (Heck) Barth. Raised and educated in Center, she attended Center Consolidated School. Elizabeth later received her GED in 1988.

Elizabeth met Alfred Schaner while both sang in the St. Martins Church choir. The two were married on October 28, 1946. They farmed and ranched on the Schaner family farm. Elizabeth worked as a cook at the 4-H Camp in Washburn for a few years and later as a Home Health Aide in Center for 18 years.
