my cup runneth over.

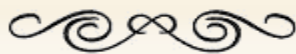

Luella Logan, age 94, of Clark, SD, died at Prairie Lakes Hospital in Watertown, SD on Sunday, January 7, 2024.

Luella Ann (Tigner) Logan was born on August 8, 1929 at her home in Faulkton, SD to Richard and Alma (Baughman) Tigner. They moved to Watertown, SD, where Luella went to school from first through fourth grade and then they moved to Clark, SD where Luella went to school from the fifth grade until graduating from high school in 1947. She spent her summers doing house work and hauling and picking potatoes.

She was a cashier at J.C. Penny's after graduation. On September 30, 1947, Luella married Byrl W. Logan in the First United Methodist Church in Watertown, SD.
