Marlene M. Moon, 77, of Rapid City, died February 2, 2016, at Rapid City Regional Hospital due to pneumonia.

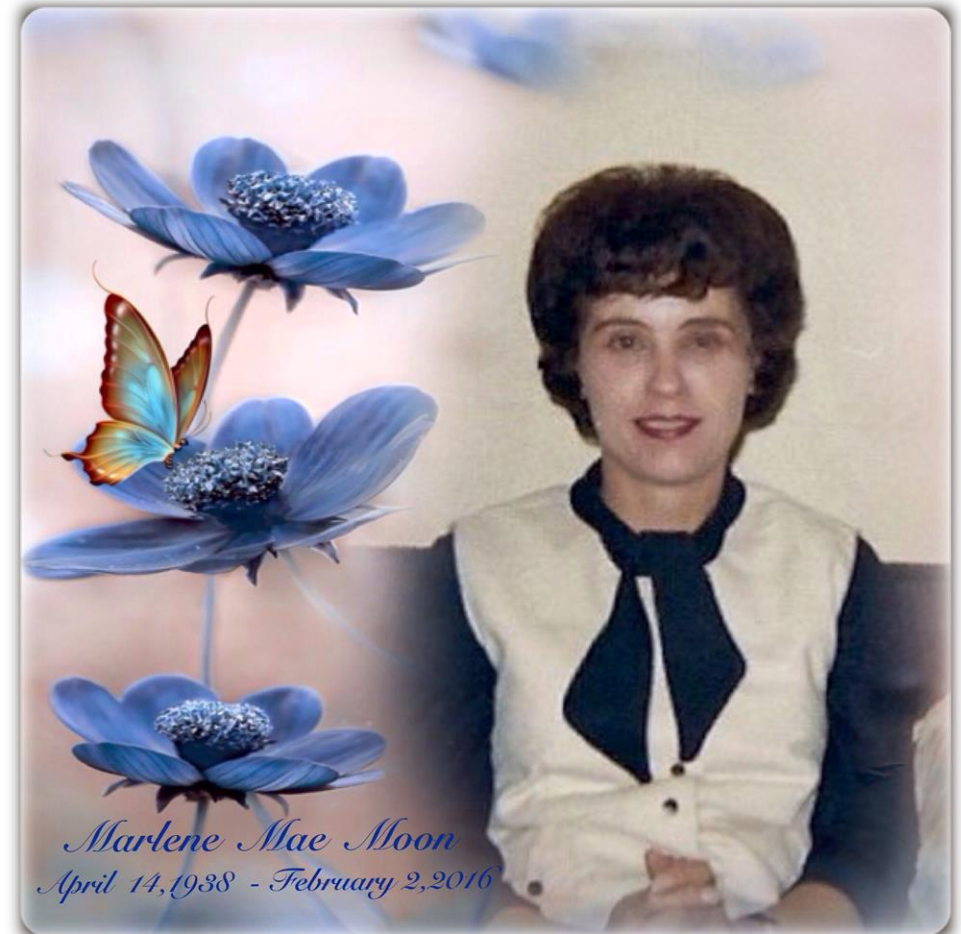
