Throughout his time in Sturgis, Dan was an active member of the Sturgis United Methodist Church and was involved in many community and professional organizations, including Lion's Club, Sturgis City Council, Old Fort Meade Museum, Kiwanis, and state and national optometric associations. He and Arlene made wonderful friends in Sturgis and they treasured the many group vacations and regular gatherings with them. Dan and Arlene raised their three sons in Sturgis, and together they enjoyed many outdoor activities. Dan especially loved to fish, hunt and camp in and around the Black Hills. An annual fishing trip to Canada with a large group of friends was a highlight for many years.


