He was transferred to Aberdeen, SD, from his employment with Benson Optical. This is where Joe and Betty had two children, Darin Maltby and Debbie (Maltby) Berg. He worked for Benson's for 17 years. He then moved his family to Williston, ND, in 1977, where he worked in the oilfield until 1986, when the oilfield company he was working for went out of business. Joe and Betty then moved to Spearfish, SD, and he worked for Wheeler Lumber in Whitewood, SD, until his retirement.

Joe loved living in the Black Hills, often going motorcycle riding with his son and many friends.

He is survived by his wife, Betty of Rapid City; his daughter, Debbie Berg and her husband, Steve, of Rapid City; his granddaughters, Adrian Miller and her husband, Preston, of Jamestown, ND, and Terry Falcon of Minot, ND; grandson, Devin Maltby, and granddaughter, Betty Maltby, both of Williston, ND. He also has four great-grandchildren.


Joe was preceded in death by his only son, Darin Maltby; his mother, Marjorie Maltby; and father, Joe Maltby.


