They lived near Union Center until 1955. The two then moved into Sturgis, SD, where they began a road construction company. They donated the time and equipment to help build the baseball field in Sturgis to

bring in the semi pro team, the Sturgis Titans in 1961. The field remains named "Strong Field" and is home to the local high school and post teams. The two of them ran the construction company until Bob's untimely death in 1966. Jessie and Bob had 2 children, Dean Strong and Karen (Strong) Froelich.

After selling the construction company, Jessie spent the bulk of her time doting on and helping to care for her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She was a loving, giving, and inspiring woman who was always there for her family. Jessie's loving and caring manner, with a side of discipline, made her a strong influence in her grandkids and great-grandkid's lives.
