

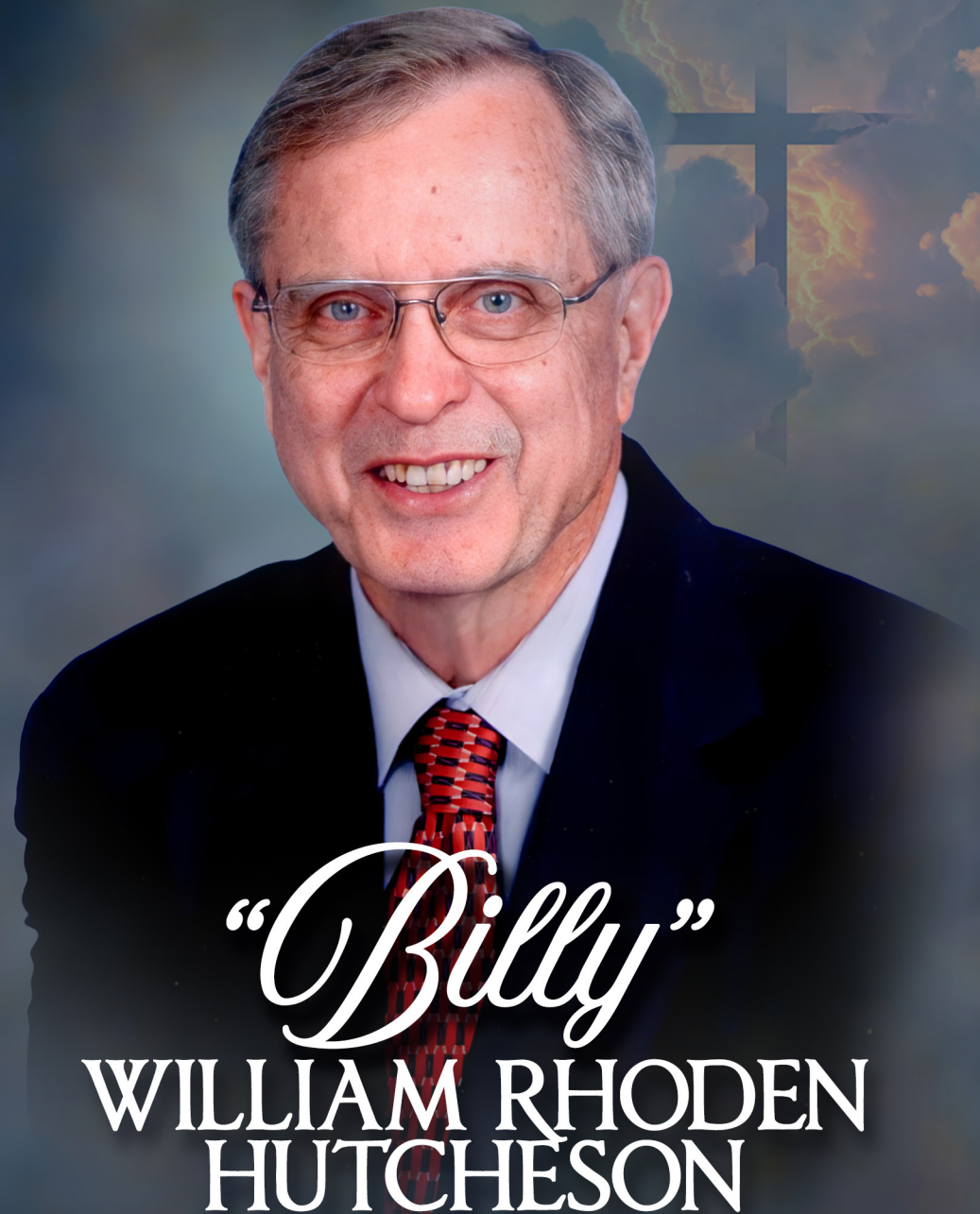

Obituary
