Raymond A. Johnson was born August 24, 1923, on the family ranch near Deers Ears. He attended country school and at the age of 14 he went to work for area ranchers. He broke horses and punched cows until he enlisted in the US Army. He was awarded a purple heart, one silver and one bronze star. Upon his honorable discharge, he returned home to western South Dakota where he continued to cowboy. He worked ranches in North Dakota and also Montana.

He married Sue Hedrick at Sturgis on February 14, 1973.

Raymond bred, trained and raced quality horses for many years. He won the Central States Fair Futurity race both July 1980 and June 1981 with the same horse. He was also known for his ability to witch wells.

Raymond was a member of the VFW and the American Quarter Horse and American Paint Horse associations.

Raymond, 88, Newell, died Friday, September 30, 2011, at his home near Newell.
