In 1969, Will was seriously injured in a construction accident and was unable to work for several years. During that time, Frieda worked to support the family. To secure their future and attain her life-long dream, she decided to go to college and become a teacher. Frieda graduated from Black Hills State in 1972, and the family moved to Newcastle, Wyoming, where she taught special education and kindergarten for over 20 years. Upon retirement, Frieda and Will moved back to Spearfish where they lived until Will's death in 2011. Frieda then moved to Newcastle to be closer to her daughter and later became a resident of Weston County Manor.

Frieda was a devoted daughter, wife, mother, and grandmother and loved the Lord with all her heart. She was a talented seamstress making most of her two daughters' clothes as well as her own and sewing for others when needed. She loved gardening, growing flowers, crocheting, and baking, especially chocolate chip cookies for the grandkids and farmer bread for everyone. But most of all, she loved spending time with family and friends. She was always ready with coffee and welcomed all guests whether it was just a chat, giving a friend a perm, or feeding breakfast to a kitchen full of deer hunters. Frieda and Will loved to go dancing, to travel, and later in their life, they enjoyed a good slot tournament and a chance to visit with new-found friends. She loved being a teacher and by chance in her later years, she lived in an apartment at Weston County Senior Center that had once been her kindergarten room. It was very special for her and gave her a chance to talk about her great memories and experiences as a teacher and all the children she had taught.


