Jacob was born March 3, 1926, to Conrad and Elizabeth Rieb in Fruitdale, SD.

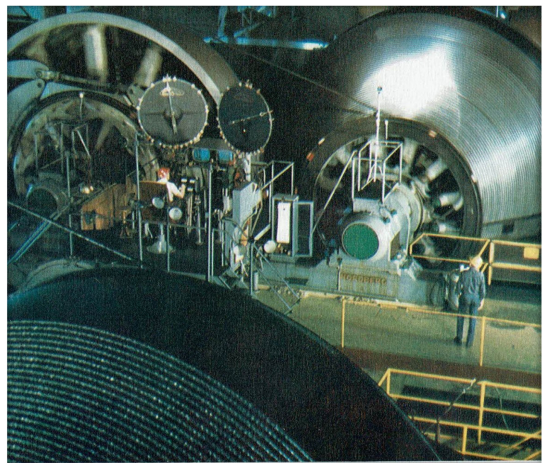

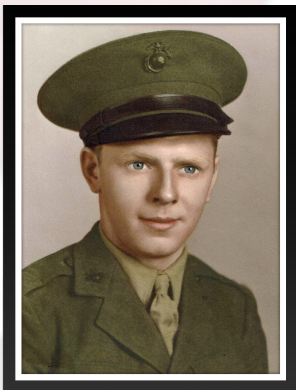
