They moved to Washington for a short time and then moved back to South Dakota to Nemo to run a chicken farm. After that they moved around to different areas in South Dakota. He earned his GED after he was married.

Roger worked at Earl's Poultry in Rapid City where his sister, Madelene, and her husband, Bobby, lived. Bobby's niece, Glenna JoAnn Robertson, had moved to Rapid to find a job, where Roger and JoAnn met. They were married in Belle Fourche, SD on September 21, 1958. They lived in Rapid City and Roger began working at Barber's Moving and Storage driving over the road.

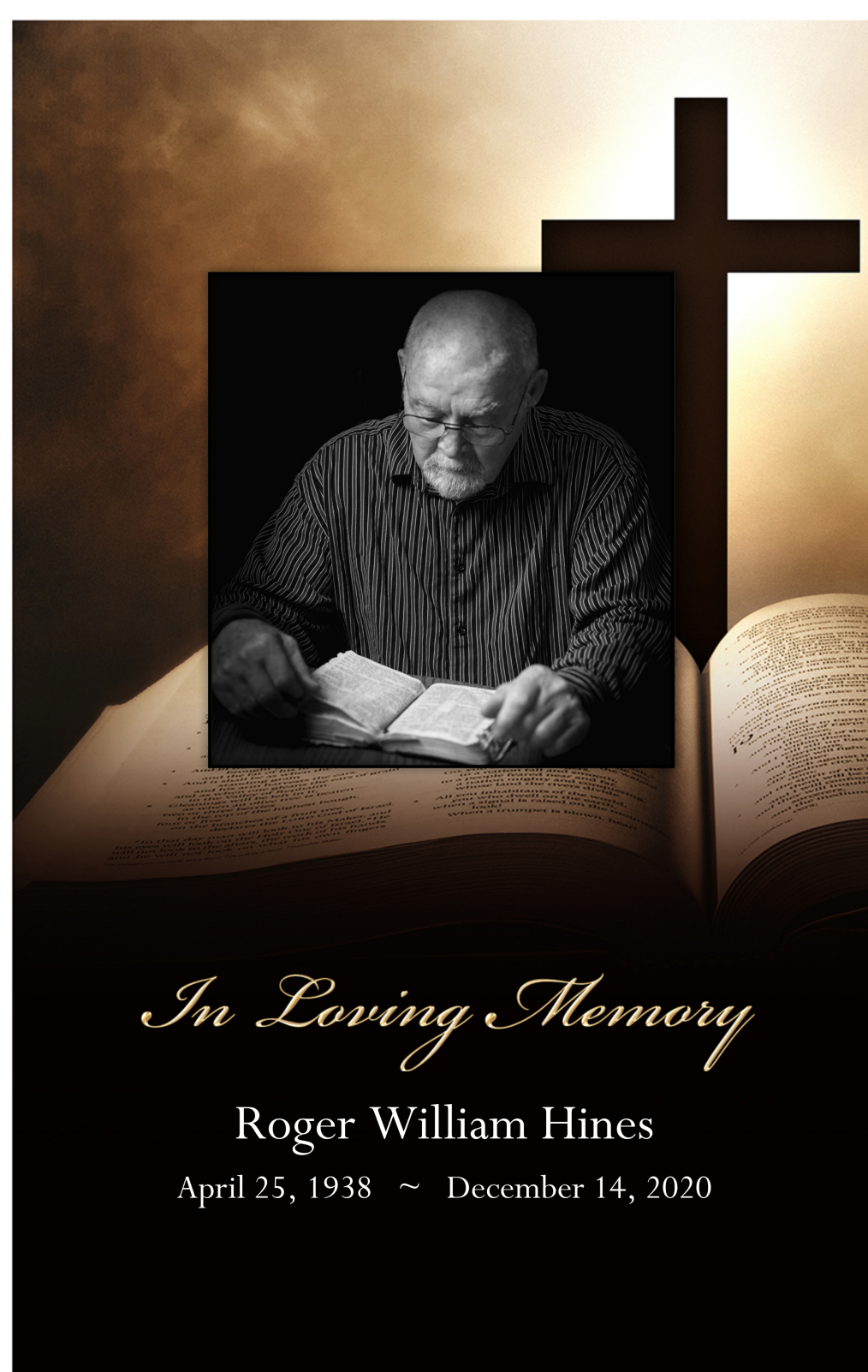
They were members of the Wesleyan Church and Roger served in various positions on the board. They are current members of the LifeSpring Wesleyan Church West.
