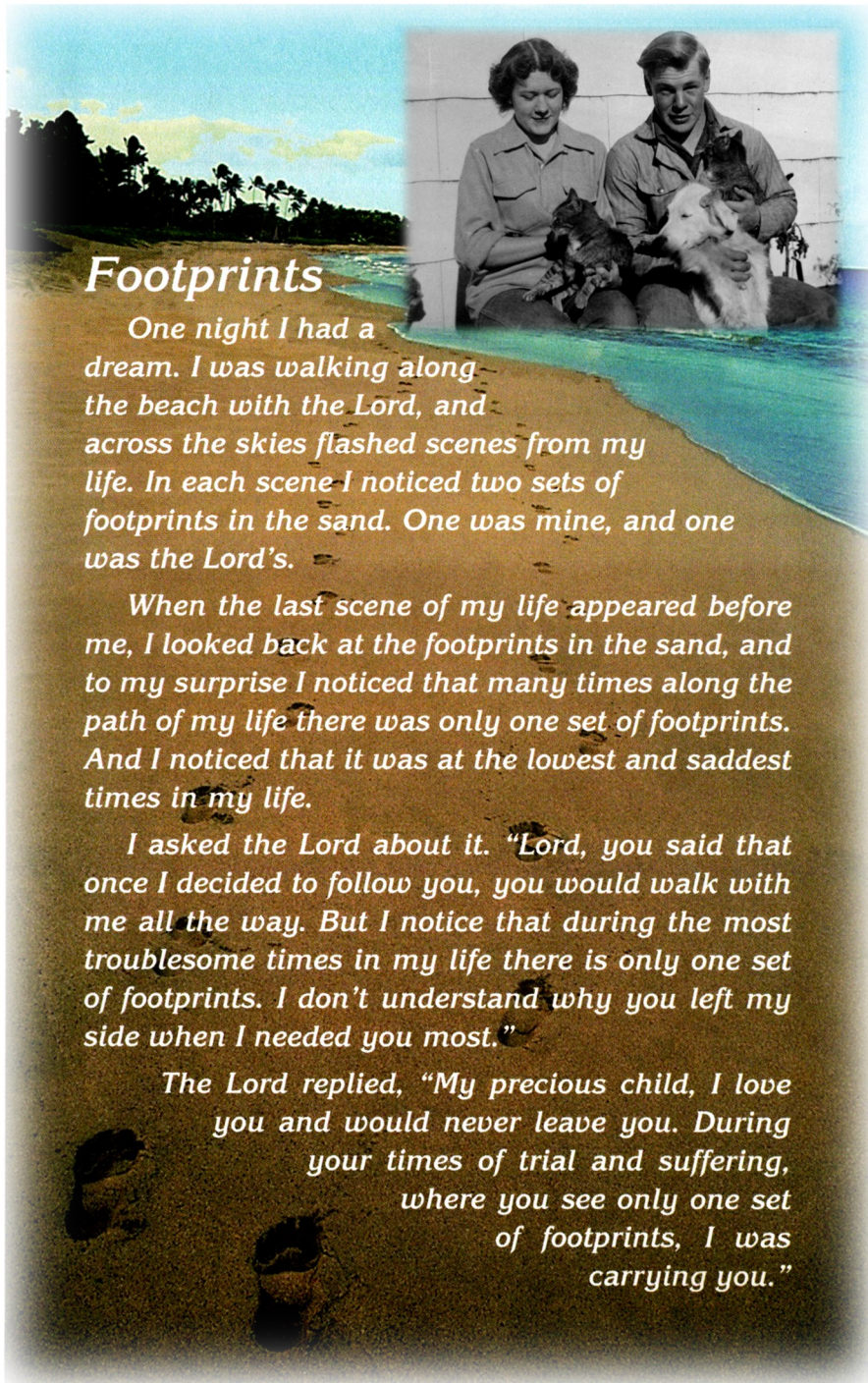




Footprints

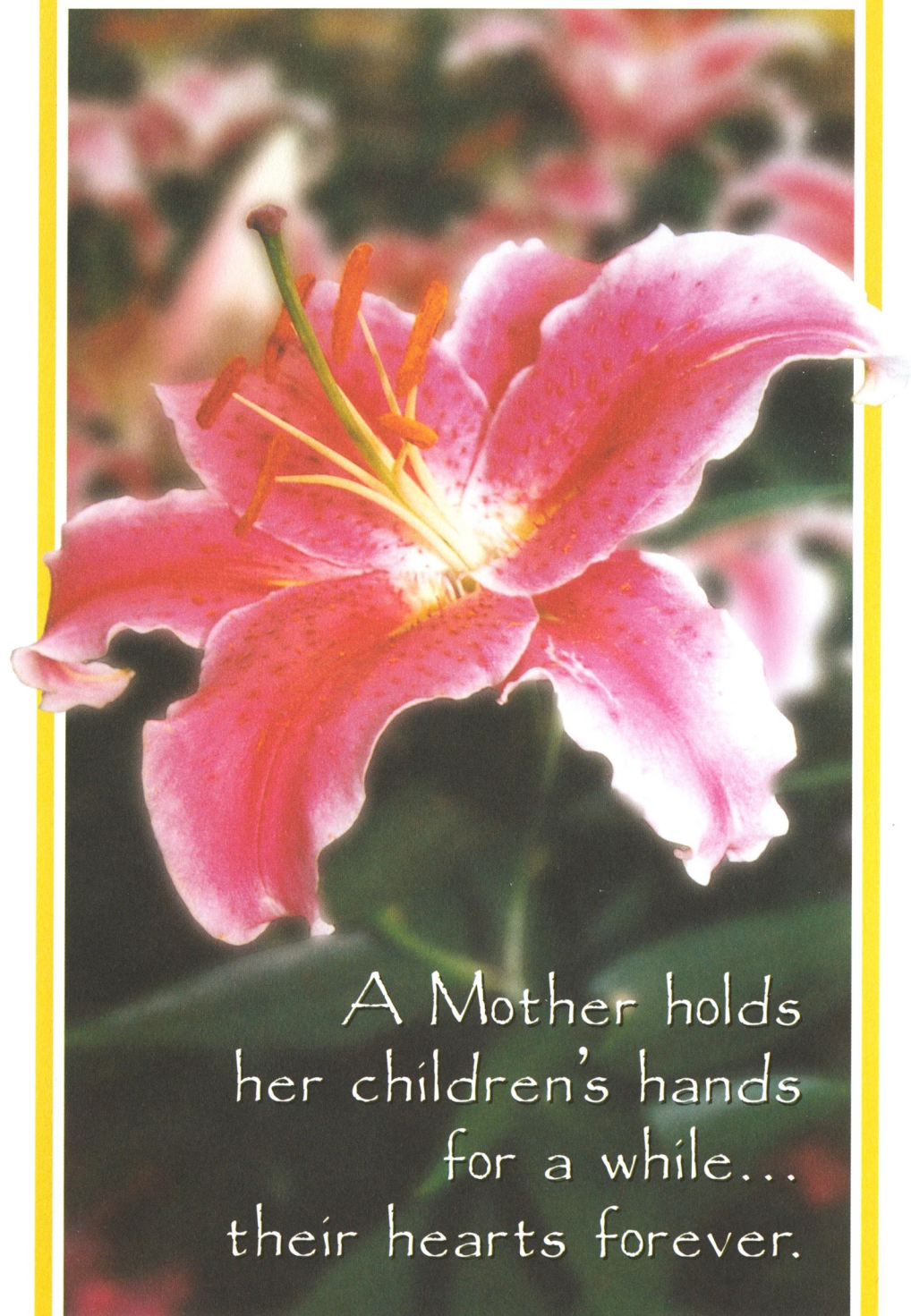
