



Jake Eugene Mooney was born on October 31, 1932, in Wheeler, Texas, to Floyd Mooney and Margaret Byard and lived in Texas until 1947, when his family moved near Haydraw, SD.

In 1951, he married Mary Klosterman. They had four children: Jerry, Mike, Corinna and Gaylene. In 1968, they purchased a ranch near Marcus. In 1976, they sold the ranch and moved to Belle Fourche, where they owned and operated the Ace Motel, a hog confinement business, and a trailer court.

In 1979, he moved to Piedmont and, in 1983, he married Lynne Nowell, adding her daughters, Amy and Dana, to his family. Jake worked for a corporate farm, and then operated a custom farming and haying operation. In 1990, they opened a seasonal campground for the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, which consumed his time in the spring and summer months.

He raised Paint horses and enjoyed rodeos, especially calf roping and team roping, first as a participant and later as a spectator. Jake was a lifetime, charter member of the H&M Roping Club. His hobbies included hunting and fishing.

Jake, 81, a long-time resident of western South Dakota, passed away at his home on Sunday, February 2, 2014.


