He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart.



Gregory Robert Bullis was born on November 7, 1947 in Valley City, N.D. to Robert E. and Mary M. (Fagereng) Bullis. He was educated in North Dakota schools where his father taught, coached, and served as Superintendent. Upon graduating from high school in Woodworth, N.D., Greg began attending college on a military scholarship at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Activities in earlier years included hunting, fishing, camping, and traveling with family and friends. A keen interest in computers led him to become extensively involved in their use long before personal computers were commonplace.

Greg was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith and was currently affiliated with the Watertown Presbyterian Church. In spite of his long-term health difficulties, Greg always had a positive attitude and a great sense of humor.
